25 Senators for judicial probe into JN Hall incident

Twenty-five Senate Members of Dhaka University, who visited Jagannath Hall on Saturday, in a joint statement called for judicial inquiry into Wednesday's police raid in Jagannath Hall and taking stern action against those to be found responsible, reports BSS.

They demanded release of all arrested students, proper compensation for the victims, necessary treatment of the injured, and giving scope for sitting examinations for those who are either injured or taken into custody.

The Senate Members, said that it was unthinkable that such a tragic incident could be taken place in a sovereign country. They termed the incident as a total violation of human rights.

They also criticised the Vice-Chancellor for not yet visiting the hall after such an incident.

The Senate Members called upon all irrespective of opinion to visit Jagannath Hall to see for themselves the excess of police there and be vocal against such inhuman activities.
