

DU classes resume

Classes of Dhaka University resumed on Monday after a fifteen-day closure.

The classes were closed and the examinations were postponed due to the indefinite strike of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD).

On the first day of opening various student organisations including ruling party's student front Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and BNP's student wing Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) brought out separate processions and held rallies on the university campus in protest against terrorism.

On the other hand the verification of identity cards at some of the halls were not followed by the hall administration on Monday.

Only the Mohsin Hall, Suryasen Hall and Jagannath Hall administrations were checking the identity cards of the students at the main gate of the halls and obstructed the outsiders entering those halls.

The hall officials were not even seen at their respective hall gates on Monday.

As per Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) which was signed among different student organisations including BCL (S-P) and JCD on Thursday the university authorities will continue verification of identity cards at all the university halls for 15 days.

Bangladesh Chhatra League (S-P) held their rally at the Aparajeyo Bangla of the university.

Addressing the rally the BCL leaders expressed their firm determination to maintain a peaceful atmosphere on the campus. They said the Chhatra League members were always against the terrorism and they would cooperate with the government in curbing terrorism from the campus and society.

The rally was addressed, among others, by BCL General Secretary Ishaq Ali Khan Panna, Abu Sayed Al Mahmud Swapan, Mahbubul Haq Shakil and Bahadur Bepary.

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal held their rally in front of the DUCSU building.

The rally was addressed, among others, by Habib-Un-Nabi Sohel, Abdul Khaleq, A.B.M. Mosharraf Hossain, Monwar Hossain Rana, Zakir Ahmed Bablu and Monir Hossain.

Addressing the rally the JCD leaders demanded immediate release of its arrested leaders and activists. They alleged that the Awami League government was continuing repression on their members. They said the democratic movement of JCD could not be stopped by repression and arrest.

Meanwhile, an activist of JCD was assaulted by its rival faction member at the Suryasen Hall on Monday.

Witnesses said, some members of Tangail faction of JCD assaulted Alam, a supporter of Mamun group at the hall premises at 4 p.m. The incident was a sequel to internal conflict.
