DU closed 7 days ahead of schedule

Dhaka University authorities have advanced the Eid vacation by seven days in view of the political situation of the country and campus situation.

According to a Press release of the university, the university syndicate in an emergency meeting on Thursday decided to start the vacation from February 10 instead of February 17 considering the tense situation on the campus as well as in the country. Classes of the university will resume on February 27.

Professor Emajuddin Ahmed, Vice-Chancellor of the University presided over the meeting.

The syndicate condemned the police action on the innocent students of the Jagannath Hall on January 31. The meeting also regretted the 'undesired' incident at the campus centering the Prime Minister's visit at Bangla Academy on February 1.
