

Partial list of terrorists submitted to DU V-C

The lists of some elements who have been disturbing the academic atmosphere of Dhaka University have been submitted to the Vice-Chancellor of the university by different student organisation the last day on Sunday of pur day ultimatum.

The university authorities in order to keep secrecy, however, did not disclose names of person on the list organisations which have submitted to him "I will not disclose it for the sake of administrative and disciplinary measures against the troublemaker and if I do it then some problems may hamper the total process," said the Vice-Chancellor while talking to the journalists.

The V-C said that the submission of the lists of terrorists, outsiders and troublemakers by different student organisations to the university authorities would be continued for long time with a view to keeping the campus always peaceful.

"Not only student organisations but also the general students will be allowed to prepare the lists of the troublemakers and submit those to me," said the Vice-Chancellor Prof Shahiduddin Ahmed.

He said the lists that would be given to him would be verified by the university authorities whether they were given intentionally to harass innocent student and then punitive measures would be taken against the alleged person.

"The punitive measures would be taken by two ways one by the university authorities through using proportional rule against the troublemakers and another by the law enforcement

agencies against both students and outsiders.

Different student organisations active on the university campus at a meeting with Vice-Chancellor Prof Shahiduddin Ahmed on Sunday evening submitted those lists to the V-C with secrecy.

The meeting, presided over by the V-C Chancellor, reviewed over all situation of the campus and discussed the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), signed by the student organisation earlier.

The meeting held at VC's residence took some resolutions.

According to outsiders will be allowed to stay at the dormitories of Dhaka University and the hall administration will take necessary measures to oust them from the halls.

The meeting also decided that a non-student leader of any student organisation will be allowed to enter the halls for only their political activities and after their activities he must have to quit the halls.

The meeting began at 7 p.m. was attended by Ishaq Ali Khan Panna, General Secretary BCL (S-P) Mahbubul Haq Shakil, Ajoy Kor Khokon and Bahadur Bapary on behalf of Bangladesh Chhatra League Habib-un-Nabi Sohel, General Secretary of JCD A.B. Mosharraf Hossain Nasiruddin Washim and Manir Hossain on behalf of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal and Obaidur Rahman Chunnun, Nurul Islam, Aslam Khan Mohsin Sarcer and Mizanur Rahman Palash represented Gana Tankrik Chhatra Oirya.

BCL, JCD hold rallies

Meanwhile Chhatra League (BCL) and BNP Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) brought out processions and held separate rallies on the Dhaka University campus on Sunday in support of their demands.

The BCL members held their rally at the Aparajeyo Bangla of the university which was addressed, among others, by Ishaq Ali Khan, General Secretary of BCL, Shahjahan Alam Saju Mahbubul Haq Shakil and Abdul Wadud Khokon.

Addressing the rally the BCL leaders demanded necessary measures on in order to maintain congenial academic atmosphere in the Dhaka University. They also said that they would extend their helping hands to the administration and university authorities to stamp out terrorism from the campus.

The BCL leaders accused particular political party of unleashing reign of terror in all the educational institutions of the country in a planned way and urged them to stop such devastating activities for the greater interest of the country.

The JCD members held their rally in front of the DUCSU building of the university. The rally addressed, among others, by Abdul Khaleq, Habib-un-Nabi Sohel, A.B.M. Mosharraf, Hossain, Monir Hossain and Kazi Rafic.

Addressing the rally the JCD leaders demanded immediate release of their leaders and activists and its President Shahiduddin Chowdhury Ani and Nasiruddin Ahmed Pintu. They also blamed Chhatra League (S-P) as they did not allow their members to come to their respective halls.

They urged the government to release their leaders immediately otherwise they expressed their vow to launch greater movement against the present government.
