

DU classes resume amid tight security

Classes in the Dhaka University resumed on Saturday amid tight security. The university authorities suspended all examinations till November 18. Different student organisations staged demonstrations on the campus.

The university was scheduled to reopen October 29 after 30 days of vacation for Eid-ul-Fitr and Durga Puja. But the authorities extended the vacation till November 10.

On Saturday, Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) staged demonstration at Apurajeya Bangla. JCD senior leaders addressed the rally.

A group of BCL leaders who did not get posts in BCL central and DU committee staged demonstrations at DU campus.

No leaders and activists of Ripon-Roton led BCL central committee and Tipu-Badsha led BCL DU committee were seen on the campus on Saturday.

The BCL rival Mijan-Rasel faction staged a rally in front of central library. They announced Ripon and Roton persona-non grata on the campus.

All DU exams postponed

All examinations of Dhaka University (DU) under the course and traditional systems have been postponed till November 18 due to unavoidable circumstances, reports BSS.

The examinations scheduled to be held from November 19 onwards would be held as per schedule, a DU press release said today.
