

Cox's Bazar Govt College facing teacher shortage

COX'S BAZAR, Apr. 20: The Cox's Bazar Govt. College is beset with manifold problems like the shortage of teachers, class room, and essential furnitures, want of hostel, and shortage of science apparatus. The college was set up in 1962. Although the college was nationalised but no development was made.

This is the only degree college (nationalised) in the district but it can not admit students for want of accommodation. There are about 1500 students in the college. The education of the students is being hampered due to shortage of teachers and class rooms.

In the meantime the students of Cox's Bazar Govt. College submitted a memorandum to Mr. M.A. Kamal, Deputy Commissioner demanding immediate fulfilment of their 15-point demands.

Earlier on the day the students boycotted their classes, held rallies and brought out a procession that paraded the main roads of the town.

The demands include upgradation of Cox's Bazar Govt. College into university college with introduction of Honours course in seven subjects, filling up of all vacant posts of teachers, development of college building, introduction of B.Sc. course, construction of hostel and auditorium, arrangement of water supply, and supply of necessary science opportunities etc.

The incoming goods are Chinese lock and key, sandals, crockeries, shoes, coins, betel nuts, buffalows while outgoing goods are milk powder, red cow, horlicks, old clothes, kerosene oil, medicines, birth control pills etc.

A six-day long training course organised by local administration at the conference room of officers club for importing training to union parishad chairman of Cox's Bazar district on rural development and union parishad administration concluded recently.

The training course was inaugurated by Mr. M.A. Kamal, Deputy Commissioner, Cox's Bazar.

It was conducted by Mr. Shamim Reza Khan, Superintendent of Police, Mr. Monsur Ali, Additional District Magistrate Mr. Sk. Muza-haruddin, Additional Deputy Commissioner (General), Mr. Zahid Ahmed, District Accounts Officer, Mr. Abdul Hakim Mandal, UNO Moiscal and Mr. Osman Ghani, UNO, Ukhia. In all fifty-seven chairmen from Cox's Bazar district participated in the training course.
