Solve DU problems politically: V-C

Professor Maniruzzaman Miah, Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University on Friday said that the roots of the campus violence lie in the politics and the problem should be solved politically.

Sparking at a workshop on Mathematics for college teachers, the Vice-Chancellor called upon the leaders of the political parties to sit together and help stop campus violence, which he termed as the number one problem eroding the education system of the nation.

Professor Maniruzzaman Miah deplored that no political parties had come forward, yet resolve the prob-

lem of campus violence and added that failure to stop campus terrorism would cost the nation heavily.

The Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University also sought cooperation of all including the political parties specially the major parties to help stop the terrorism on the campuses.
