DU campus peaceful

Peace on the tense Dhaka University campus lingered for the fifth day on Tuesday troublemakers sat on the fence amidst backlash to Friday's killings, reports UNB.

Terrorists and outsiders reduced in number in some residential halls of the university after the killing of two students and authorities ultimatum against armed elements and outsiders.

Residents of Mohsin, Suryasen, Jashimuddin, Ziaur Rahman and Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Halls said their halls were now free from terrorists and outsiders.

These four halls are known as the strongholds of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal. Mamun and Mahmud, two activists of JCD, were gunned down early Friday, in an inner conflict.

Most of the gunmen left these halls after the killing, but outsiders were there. The outsiders, staying for long in those dormitories, also left on Monday after authorities served notice for them to quit and the ruling party tabooed activity of its student wing.

Paramilitary BDR and helmeted riot police have been deployed in these four hall areas to guard against further untoward incident.

Campus sources, however, said the "armed cadres" of both the warring factions of JCD were now staying at Fazlul Huq and Shahidullah Halls.

They said armed elements and outsiders were still roaming in Salmullah, Jagannath and Zahirul Huq Hall areas.
