

DU campus still tense

Dhaka University campus remained tense for the third consecutive day on Sunday following the killing of Moin Hossain Raju.

Eye-witnesses said that the rival groups were storing arms and ammunition again in their respective dormitories to strengthen position. The movements of armed youths were also seen at Madhu's canteen and arts building areas.

Armed 'watch-men' were also posted by students to guard the halls.

It may be mentioned that Moin Hossain Raju, a leader of Chhatra Union, was killed by armed youth on Friday near TSC.

The supporters of Chhatra Union who were ousted by JCD on Friday from Surja Sen, Mohsin, Jasimuddin and Ziaur Rahman Halls, could not return to their respective halls till Sunday.

Meanwhile, Gonotantric Chhatra Oikkya (GCO) Dhaka University unit brought out a procession and held a rally on the campus demanding arrest and trial of the killers of

Razu.

The rally held before Madhu's canteen was addressed by Rokanuzzaman Rokan and Mustak Alam Tolu.

They alleged that the killers of Razu were moving freely in and around the campus but the law-enforcing agencies did not take any action against them.

They called upon the student community to build movement against the killers of Razu as well as the terrorists.

GCO will also observe country-wide Mourning Day today (Monday) in protest against the killing of Razu.

Centrally, GCO will bring out a mourning procession from Aparajeo Bangla of Dhaka University at 10.30 a.m.

Meanwhile, Dhaka University Teachers' Association (DUTA) will observe three-hour work abstention on Tuesday from 10.30 a.m. in protest against the killing of Razu and recent campus violence.
