

## DU Syndicate forms probe committee

The Dhaka University Syndicate has formed a 4-member inquiry committee to probe into Saturday's incidents in which some students went on rampage in the campus, reports UNB.

The Syndicate held an emergency meeting with VC Prof. M. Maniruzzaman Miah in the chair and discussed the overall incidents that took place in the Arts Faculty building on Saturday.

Syndicate also declared as "illegal" a planned strike called for today (Sunday) by some students and said Saturday's violent activities was completely against discipline.

It observed that the University authorities would always consider any logical demand submitted by any student. The meeting further observed that a section of newspapers published confusing information about Saturday's incidents.

It was further informed by the Syndicate that Dr. Badrul Alam was not involved in any examinations in the honours course that was appeared by accused Ansar Ali.

Dr. Alam was a member of M.Sc. Final year's viva-voce examination in which Ansar Ali did not fail, it was told at the Syndicate meeting.

It was mentioned that Ansar Ali was admitted in 1980-81 session under special consideration. He got 2nd division in his SSC and HSC examinations. It was impossible to take admission in departments like Physics without 1st division in both SSC and HSC, Syndicate said.

Ansar Ali passed in honours degree in 1984 with 3rd class, but later he obtained 2nd class after appearing in improvement examination. He failed in 1985's M.Sc. final year examination and in next two years he did not appear at the examination, the Syndicate said.

Syndicate hoped that these information about Ansar Ali should dispel misunderstanding and urged all to cooperate in the smooth running of the university.
