

Three outsiders arrested Police raid three DU halls, arms recovered

Police raided three residential halls of Dhaka University and received two cut-rifles and sixtyone bullets in the early hours on Sunday.

Police took three outsiders into custody for interrogation.

Witnesses said, a large contingent of police cordoned the three residential halls—Zahurul Haq, Salimullah and Jagannath the stronghold of Awami League backed BCL and conducted raid from 4 a.m. to 7:30 a.m. During the raid police recovered one cut-rifle from Zahurul Haq Hall gate and arrested three outsiders. They were identified as Imroka Hossain, son of Maksudur Rahman, Abul Kalam alias Sabuj son of Abdul Matin Chowdhury and Md. Selim Ahmed, son of Md. Abdul Latif.

Police also recovered a cut-rifle, 54 bullets, four cocktails and three hand-telephone sets from Salimullah Hall.

The arms and ammunition were not found in anyones possession.

UNB adds:—During the raid, Provosts and House Tutors of the halls were present.

Resident of the halls said a number

of "terrorists" gave their false identity to police and evaded arrest.

As soon as police left the halls, the hoodlums came out at the hall gates they control day and night.

No procession was, however, brought out to protest the raids, as the university authorities had recently warned of stern action if anyone tried to obstruct entry of law enforcement.
