BCL (A-A), 8 other parties boycott

JCD; Shibir file nominations for DUCSU polls

Candidates of four student organisations, including Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD), on Saturday submitted their nomination papers for contesting the DUCSU and hall union elections scheduled to be held on July 31, reports BSS.

Student organisations belonging to CSAC (Central Students Action Council), which had split a year back, did not declare their panel for contesting polls.

JCD, Islamic Chhatra Shibir, Islami Chhatra Sena and Chhatra Bangla Parishad have declared their panels for the DUCSU and hall union elections.

Saturday was the date for submission of nomination papers for DUCSU and hall union polls.

According to the election commission, different hall authorities received 216 nomination papers from the candidates for contesting 20 DUCSU seats. The number of candidates for 168 seats for 14 hall union was not known.

JCD nominated Rafiqui Islam Zaglu, Shahiduddin Anny and Ali Akkas Nadim as DUCSU VP, GS

and AGS candidates while Chhatra Sean nominated Baktiyar Uddin, Bashar Bhuiyan and Abul Bashar as VP, GS and AGS. Chhatra Shibir declared Helal-Amin-Yusuf as VP, GS and AGS and Chhatra Bangla Parishad declared Zahir-Rokan-Shipaon as VP, GS and AGS.

Bangladesh Chhatra League (N-S), Bangladesh Chhatra Union (BCU), Samajtantric Chhatra Front (SCF), Bangladesh Chhatra League (SA-SA), Bangladesh Chhatra Federation (BCF) brought out separate processions and held rallies on the campus protesting against the decision of the university authorities not to allow special admission for student leaders on the eve of DUCSU polls.

Leaders of some student organisations had participated in the previous DUCSU polls after taking special admission.

This year the University authorities did not give the opportunity for special admission to the leaders at the request of Dhaka University Teachers Association (DUTA). DUTA in a proposal demanded an end to such a bad tradition.
