

## CU students not attending classes

CHITTAGONG, July 21:— The students have been showing lukewarm attitude to attend their classes in Chittagong University even after six days of its reopening.

Even the temporary postponement of movement programme by the Chittagong University Teachers Association (CUTA) could not make the students willing to turn up at the university to attend their classes. It seems that the general students do not feel much secure to come to the campus that remained cordoned by the police and Bangladesh Rifles personnel for past seven months. Moreover, the students appear watching the development on the campus within the stipulated period of fifteen days set by the Acting President before coming to their classes.

Meanwhile, the CUTA President Prof Yusuf Sharif Ahmed Khan and General Secretary Dr. Abul Kalam Azad in a joint statement to the Press declared to postpone all programmes against the incumbent Vice-Chancellor Prof Alamgir Mohammed Shirajuddin. But the CUTA leaders simultaneously warned that

the general teachers of Chittagong University would not tolerate any movement by the vested quarter, to give any appointment of any person and holding of meeting and election during the period of fifteen days.

The fifteen days deadline set by the Acting President and Chancellor of Universities through a meeting with Chittagong University Syndicate members and leading teachers would expire on July 31. However the office of Chittagong university Vice-Chancellor remained inoperative for second consecutive days today in the face of agitation of Sammilito Chatra Ayikko Parishad. There was rally held in front of University Administrative Building today by the Parishad supporters.
