No move yet to settle CU teachers' dispute

CHITTAGONG, July 17:—No clear move appears to have been undertaken by any quarter today to settle the squabble of Chittagong University teachers at the call of the Acting President, Mr. Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed.

It seemed that the feuding teachers whom the Acting President asked to settle the differences amicably still appeared adamant to their motives.

What was conspicuous was that the teachers who broadly got split-up in three different groups remained locked up in groupwise discussion for evaluation of relevant points in the statement of the Acting President who is also the Chancellor of the Universities. The three feuding groups are: Jatiyotabadi Shikkhok Parishad, General Teachers Parishad and Democratic Teachers Forum. The Chittagong University Teachers Association put weight in support of

the Jatiyotabadi Shikkhok Parishad.
The feuding groups of university teachers instead of settling their discord appeared more keen to take decision about their future course of action.

However, the situation in Chittagong University continued to be tense despite the presence of heavy contingent of law enforcing agency forces. The Shibir-backed Sammilito Chhatra Oikya Parishad today held demonstration and took out procession on the campus to press the resignation of the Vice-Chancellor. The APSU supporters also held similar demonstration and procession in support of Vice-Chancellor Prof. Alamgir Mohammad Shirajuddin who came to his office for a short time under escort police.
