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Devendra College facing teacher shortage

MANIKGANJ, Aug. 17.—Gov-
ernment Devendra College, has been
facing manifold problems for a long
time.

The college has no required num-
ber of teachers. At present one post
of professor and one post of assistant
professor, in the department of Ben-
gali, and post of lecturer in Islamic
Studies and Arabic, one post of
Associate Professor and one post of
lecturer in Management, one post of
Assistant Professor and one post of
lecturer in Accounting, one post of
Associate Professor in Economics,
and post of Associate Professor and
one post of lecturer in Islamic His-
tory and Culture, one post of lecturer
in Philosophy, one post of Associate
Professor in Physics, one post of
Associate Professor and one post of
lecturer in Chemistry, one post of
Associate Professor in Botany, one
post of Associate Professor in Zoolo-
gy and one post of Demonstrator
have been lying vacant for a long
time.

Besides one post of librarian and
one post of senior cataloguer are
lying vacant.

The study of the students of Gov-
ernment Devendra College is being
affected badly due to absence of
number of teachers.

The dream of the students to study
honours in Political Science and
Accounting in Government Deven-
dra College has not yet been mater-
ialised.

An official source told this corres-
pondent that the government
allowed the college authority to open
honours in the two subjects in April
1986 but the university authority did
not give approval due to lack of
necessary teachers. The government
has yet taken no step to solve the
problem.

Hundreds of students of Man-
ikganj district are deprived of the
study of honours in Political Science
and Accounting. They are now suf-
fering from a greet frustration.

The college has no boundary wall.
The college authority is facing a
problem for the absence of the
boundary wall.

There is no canteen in the college
area. As a result the students are
suffering.

The college has no motor vehicle.
Most of the students of the college
have been affected.

The teachers and employees of
Devendra College are deprived of
residential accommodation. Many of
them have to come to the college for
performing duties from the remote
areas of the district.

The college needs additional clas-
srooms to cater to the need of the
students. The study of the students is
being affected for want of additional
classrooms.

The college has not been properly
electrified. There are no fans in the
classrooms. The absence of fan
causes sufferings to the teachers and
students during the summer
