Teacher shortage in Srimangal College

SRIMANGAL, May 22.— The Srimangal Govt. College has been facing manifold problems including acute shortage of teachers.

The college was nationalised in 1985 and it was expected that the problems would be solved but nothing has been done as yet.

Srimangal Government College, the only seat of higher education in the Upazila is facing heavy rush of students having inadequate number of teachers in English, Bengali, Philosophy, and Accounting. It is also facing accommodation problem.

It is learnt that the Principal who joined the college last year, will retire by the end of this month. It will create an administrative deadlock. The post of the Vice-Principal has been lying vacant since long. The retirement of the Principal at a crucial moment will give rise to many problems.

There is no sufficient number of benches and desks. The college au-

thority will face the tremendous difficulty to conduct the ensuing H.S.C. Examinations scheduled to be started from June for want of benches and desks or accommodation. The College needs at least 150 pairs of benches and desks, the immediate appointment of more teachers in English, Bengali and Philosophy, the construction of more rooms, and the development of laboratory etc. The appointment of Vice-Principal is urgently needed.
