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Nowab Foyzunnessa Govt College facing various problems

COMILLA, Nov 18:-The Nowab Foyzunnessa Government College, Laksam is beset with manifold problems including shortage of teachers, accommodation, lack of educational atmosphere and hostels for hampering the education of students.

The college established in 1943 on 8.16 acres of land was nationalised in 1982, but the infrastructural and other facilities have not been provided during the last few years.

When contacted the Principal of the college told me that there are 2940 students including 150 in Honors Department. There are 27 teachers out of 62 in the colleges that are facing shortage of teachers, accommodation, lack of transport facilities and academic building.

The Honors Course in Management, Accountancy and Zoology was introduced in 1999. The college authority demanded introduction of Honors Courses in eight more subjects.

There is no residential accommodation for the teachers. The college has a small common room and the students are deprived of the facilities for newspapers,

magazines and periodicals.

The science students are facing problems for want of full-fledged science laboratory, which is facing shortage space and sitting arrangement.

There is small number of books.

The college lacks Medicare facility and the irregular power supply is causing scarcity of water and the students and teachers suffer.

Out of 62 posts of teachers 35 posts including Associate Professors, Assistant Professor and Lecturers are lying vacant in the college for a long time hampering the education of the students.

The vacant post are; 14 Associate Professors, 12 Assistant Professor and nine Lecturers.

The post of head assistant, accountant, chief assistant and electrician are lying vacant.

The Principal said that reminders have been given on several occasion to the authority concern but nothing has been done as yet in this regard.

The guardians and the local leaders urged the authority concern to fill up the vacant post of teachers on an emergency basis for imparting education to the students.
