Literacy rate 44.30 per cent

The current rate of literacy in the country is 44.30 per cent. This was stated by Education Minister ASHK Sadek in the Jatiya Sangsad on Wednesday during the question-answer hour.

Mr Sadek quoted a sample vital registration (SVR) of 1995 conducted by the Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics in 1996 while replying to a question from Shah Hadiuzzaman of Awami League. Mr Sadek also said the number of SSC passed persons in the country is 49,76,500 and graduates 12,71,000.

Replies to a question from Moulana Delwar Hossain Sayedee of Jamaat-e-Islami, Education Minister said a total of 2031 primary schools were set up in the country with government and foreign assistance during the period between 1991-92 and 1995-96 fiscal.

Mr Sadek also told the House that primary education in all thanas of the country has been made compulsory since 1991. He was replying to a question of Zafirul Islam Chowdhury of BNP.

Responding to a question from Vice-Principal Mohammad Abdus Shahid, of Awami League Education Minister said that the government has a plan to make 30 lakh people literate in the fiscal 1996-97 with a view to eradicating illiteracy side by side making Primary Education compulsory. Mr Sadek further said four projects of the government in non-formal education sector are in the way of implementation and more programmes in this regard will be taken in future.
