Pry teachers hunger strike continues

The 72-hour sit-in and hunger strike by teachers of non-government primary schools in front of the National Press Club entered its second day on Sunday.

The association of non-government primary school teachers gave the call for the hunger strike and sit-in programmes to press the demand for nationalisation of services of teachers of non-government primary schools.

Dozens of teachers from different parts of the country thronged in front of the National Press Club on Saturday and squatted on the Topkhana road. Some of them went on a 72-hour hunger strike to press their demands.

On Sunday, leaders of different political parties including Abdur Razzak, Presidium member of Bangladesh Awami League came to the venue and expressed their solidarity with the striking teachers.
