

## Gunshots at DUCSU function, 6 hurt

The installation ceremony of the Dhaka University Central Students Union (DUCSU) was marred by gun shots and explosions of cocktails at the TSC island on Wednesday evening.

At least six persons were injured in the incident, one of them seriously. Mr. Baku was admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital in an unconscious condition. Five others were released after first aid.

According to eye witnesses a group of people suddenly opened gun shots and threw cocktails at the function venue while the students were enjoying cultural function.

Joint Convener of Jatiyabadi Chhatra Dal Fazlul Haq Milan condemned the incident. He demanded punishment to people who opened fire in a peaceful installation ceremony. He held those people, who could not accept the victory of Chhatra Dal in DUCSU election, responsible for the incident.
