Teacher shortage in Rajbari Govt. school

RAJBARI, Aug. 23:— The student of Rajbari Government Boys and Girls High Schools brought out a procession recently protesting the shortage of teachers in many important subjects including English, Mathematics and General Science of the schools.

It may be mentioned here that education of the students of these two government schools was hampered due to shortage of teachers.

In boys schools, the post of 9 teachers out of 26 and in government girls school the posts of 10 teachers out of 24. The posts of assistant

headmaster and headmistress have also been lying vacant for about 5 years.

The students paraded the main streets of the town with placards demanding immediate appointment of teachers.

They also handed over a memorandum to the Deputy Commissioner demanding solution of the problem.

The students of both the schools also boycotted their classes on the following day in protest of beating a student of the boys school by the Headmaster for joining the procession...
