## JCD violence protested by BCL, DSA

Bangladesh Chhatra League (A-A) and Democratic Student Alliance (DSA) on Saturday brought out processions and held rallies on the campus in protest against the acts of violence by JCD.

BCL organised its rally before the Madhu's Canteen which was addressed by BCL central Vice-President Saiful Ahad Salim, DU Unit President Golam Mostafa Sujan and General Secretary Kamruzzaman Ansari.

Speakers at the rally were critical of JCD and said that JCD was hatching conspiracy to shut down the University.

They called upon the democratic student organisations to come forward to evict the trouble mongers of JCD.

(DSA) held a rally in front of Arts Faculty. It was addressed by Nazmul Haq Prodhan of Chhatra League (N-S) and Nur Ahmed Bakul of Chhatra Moitree.

The speakers at the rally held JCD responsible for creating violence on Friday, midnight on DU campus.

The DSA leaders called upon the students' community to build resistance against the student organisations which were trying to establish its supremacy by resorting terrorism.

They also demand arrest of those responsible for campus violence.

Meanwhile, Shah Alam and Asim Kumar Ukil, President and General Secretary of Bangladesh Chhatra League (A-A) respectively on Saturday condemned the acts of violence by JCD and demanded punishment of those involved in this connection.

In a joint statement, the BCL leaders said that JCD was creating violence at a time when the examinations of Masters and Degree (Honours) have been going on in peaceful manner.

Terming the Friday's clash of JCD as internal conflict, the BCL leaders said some JCD leaders including Shahid and Bablu had been killed following its internal clash a few years ago.

The BCL leaders called upon the students' community to raise their voice against campus violence.

They also called upon the democratic student organisations to build resistance against the identified terrorists of JCD.
