APSU thanks govt for fair polls

The leaders of All-Party Students Unity (APSU) said the fifth parliament election was held in a free and fair atmosphere in the country on Wednesday.

Addressing a Press conference at the National Press Club on Wednesday evening. Just after one hour of closing of votes the APSU leaders said they did not receive any information about rigging in the election. There were no scope for rigging in the election, they opined.

The APSU leaders thanked the Government for holding a free and fair election in the country.

They further said if they receive any allegation about polls rigging they would take decision later on.

The APSU leaders said the movement for their ten-point demand would continue. They hoped that those who would form the next Government after being elected would fulfil the hopes and aspiration of different professional groups, including the demands of APSU.

Replying to a question the APSU leaders said they did not demand ban on the political activities of Jatiya Party. They demanded punishment Activities of former President Hossein Mohammed Ershad and his associates for specific offences against them.

Replying to another question APSU leaders said they were not dictating the present Government and would not dictate the coming elected government.

Replying to another question the APSU leaders said they have no information about any violence during the election.
