

Students extend support to movement

Leaders of the All Party Students Unity at a rally held Sunday in Nur Hossain Square near GPO also extended their total support to the countrywide programme of the opposition parties which begins from Monday, reports BSS.

Presided over by Abdus Sattar Khan of BSD Chhatra League President the rally was addressed by Faizul Hakim Lala of Bangladesh Chhatra Federation (BCF), Sujauddin Jafar of Ganotantric Chhatra Union and Sushanta Mishra of Jatiya Chhatra Oikya.

The rally announced that the students rallies will be held in different parts of the country.

It also urged the students to organise similar demonstrations on November 6 in front of the Zila Council offices all over the country. Besides, All Party Students Unity will bring out a procession on November 8 in support of their demands including resignation of the present government, withdrawal of the Ordinance '90 and reopening of all the educational institutions.

UNB adds: All Party Students Unity (APSU) Sunday directed all its units at district and upazila levels to unitedly carry forward the anti-government movement.

The leaders of 22-student organisations and DUCSU at a meeting on October 26 decided up keep their unity intact till the fall of the present regime.

APSU sources said a circular on the decision of the meeting had already been dispatched to the district and upazila APSU units.

The Central leaders of APSU components have urged all its lower level units to form a common front with all other student organisations and establish 'deep' understanding with democratic outlook.

The 22 student organisations and DUCSU spoke from a single platform and joined hands on October 10 after a gap of three years.

Their leaders took fresh vow in front of Aparjay Bangla to remain united keeping the body of Zahed who was killed in police firing on October 10 during opposition sponsored "Dhaka siege" programme.

"There is no alternative to unity of the students to ensure the downfall of the present government", the directive of APSU added.

The APSU in directive also warned all concerned about the conspiracy being hatched to weaken the students unity and asked to boycott ministers, parliament members and Jatiya Party socially and prevent their entry into educational institutions.

The All Party Students Unity unanimously adopted "Down with Autocracy" and "Free Democracy" as their slogans.

It also advised to withhold students union elections till further intimation for the sake of the on-going anti-autocratic movement.
