

DUTA posts shared

President White panel, Secy-Gen Blue

The ruling Awami League-backed Blue Panel and Opposition party BNP-backed White Panel shared the 15 executive posts of Dhaka University Teachers' Association (DUTA) in the election held on Sunday.

The Blue Panel bagged eight posts including the General Secretary and the Vice-President while the White Panel got seven posts including the President, the Treasurer and the Joint-Secretary.

Prof A.F.M. Yousuf Haider of Physics Department was elected President defeating Prof M Mostafa

Chowdhury of Political Science Department by a thin margin of four votes while Prof Md Hossain Mansur of Geology Department was reelected General Secretary beating Dr Nazrul Islam of Psychology by the same margin of votes. Prof Haider bagged 444 votes and Prof Hossain Mansur got 443 votes.

Nine hundred eight votes out of the total 1161 were cast in the election held at the Dhaka University Club on Sunday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. without break.

Imamul Haq of Soil Science, member, (459 votes), Kazi Afroz Jahan Ara of the Institute of Education and Research, member, (461 votes), Prof Md Shahadat Ali of Zoology, member, (521 votes) and Prof Harun Kader M Yousuf of Bio-Chemistry Department, member, (479 votes).

Nazrul Islam of Botany, member, (430 votes), Prof A.K.M. Sirajul Islam Khan of Micro-Biology, member, (481 votes), and Prof Md Khalilur Rahman of Bio-Chemistry, member (427 votes).

Prof Hadiuzzaman of the Department of Botany conducted the election as Election Commissioner.
