Mass literacy programme in Faridpur

FARIDPUR, July 27.—The mass Literacy Programme launched by the government has gained momentum in the district following spontaneous participation of the illiterate people.

At present 387 mass education centres have been functioning under the patronage of government and the non-government organisations with a target to educate at least 12000 people by the end of this year.

One hundred centres have been sponsored by the government, 125 centres by the district administration and 95 centres by Legal Aid Foundation, 30 by other agency and 30 centres by Faridpur Development Authority (FDA). Besides the district administration has set up seven centres within Faridpur Pourashava.

The Thana-wise break up of the centres is as follows: 13 in Sadar, 24 in Nagarkanda, 31 in Modhukhali, 3 in Charbhadrashan, 23 in Alfadanga, 20 in Bhanga and 21 in Bopalmar.

Marked progress is observed in every centre. The implementation of the programme is going on under the supervision of A.K.M. Manjurul Huque, Additional District Magistrate, Faridpur. This programme for the removal of illiteracy has created a tangible awareness among the people.

Law and order situation

The law and order situation of the district was reviewed in a meeting held on July 16 with Mr. K.M. Nurul Huda, DC in the chair at his conference room.

The different problems came up for discussion in the meeting and resolutions were taken to solve them.

Discussions on the on-going HSC examination, flood situation and price spiral got prominence in the meeting.

The Deputy Commissioner gave directives to the TNOs to remain vigilant over the flood situation and urged them to ensure proper distribution of the relief goods.
