Education without

technology not

complete: Mahbub

Education Minister Mahbub ur Rahman said in Dhaka on Sunday, that the education policy and system would be incomplete without science and technology. Without science and technology, social progress and self-reliance could not be attained, he said.

The Minister was inaugurating a two-day seminar on "Problems of science and technology education at pre-university level" organised by Bangladesh Science Academy.

Describing the scientists as the best sons of the nation, the Education Minister said it was our duty to establish them in the society and create opportunity for them so that they could contribute to the progress and prosperity of the society.
