



Talents urged to oppose copying

DHAKA, Aug 15 (BSS): First Lady Begum Raushan Ershad today called upon the meritorious students to raise their voice against copying in the examinations and help create a strong public opinion against this social vice.

The First Lady was addressing as the chief guest a reception organised by the Education Ministry in honour of the students who secured top posi-
