Concern over killings in DU

Different Socio-cultural, political and student organisations in separate statements Monday expressed grave concern over the killings of two students and a street urchin on Dhaka University campus following a two-hour long bloody clashes between activists of rival student organisations - Bangladesh Chhatra League (A-A) and Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD).

The organisations urged the concerned authorities to revive

conducive academic atmosphere on the campuses, taking stern measures against the trouble mongers in different educational institutions. The organisations termed that repetition of the violent activities would harm the newly gained democracy and hopes and aspirations of the common people.

They urged the parent political parties of both the conflicting student organisations to immediately settle the issue

Our DU Correspondent adds: Dhaka University Teachers' Association (DUTA) at a meeting Monday expressed grave concern

over the killings of three persons including two students.

Presided over the Prof. Anowarullah, Chowdhury president of the association, the meeting opined that the teachers' community and the authorities were engaged in resisting terrorism but it was not possible for them to achieve the goal.

It urged all concerned including the government and political parties to take effective measures for restoration of peace and congenial atmosphere on the campus.

The meeting also demanded immediate arrests and trial of the persons responsible for the killings.

The DUTA will organise a meeting on the same issue at 12 noon on tomorrow October 30.
