Dig canals to offset vagaries of nature: Zia

HUSNABAD (Kushtia)
Dec. 14: President Ziaur Rahman inaugurated here today the work of voluntary re-excavation of Hissa River by the local people, reports BSS.

President Zia himself participated in the re-excavation work of the silted river along with thousands of people. The Hissa which takes off from the Mathabhanga river at Mahishakandi and falls into the same river at Khalishakandi will be re-excavated from Mahishakandi to Tajpur a stretch of over 10 miles.

The river which is now 50 feet wide, will be widened to 65 feet and its depth of four feet will be increased to 10 feet. Seven thousand acres of lands will be benefitted by the irrigation facilities helping local farmers to grow three crops a year.

When completed 70 thousand people in 35 villages under Ramkrishnapur, Pragpur, Mathurapur, Philipnagar, Moricha, Hogalbaria and Pearpur unions will be benefitted.

The project will help in increasing an additional production of 20 thousand maunds of paddy, 1.75 lakh maunds of wheat and cash crops like

jute, sugarcane, tobacco, mustard and pulses of several lakh maunds annually. It is expected to be completed by the end of May 1980.

Earlier addressing the participants—over 20 thousand at the site of the project President Zia urged them to take up more such projects on voluntary basis throughout the country so that the vagaries of nature including drought could be offset in doubling food production.

Congratulating the people of the area for taking up the project on voluntary basis, he said that the country-wide re-excavation programme would provide round-the-year irrigation facilities to the farmers to produce huge quantity of additional foodgrains.
