

# 30.31 pc pass Comilla Board HSC exams

The results of Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations held under Comilla Education Board this year were announced on Monday showing a percentage of success at 30.31.

A total of 73,244 candidates, including 19,095 girls, appeared at the examinations from 121 centres this year. Of them, 22,202 candidates including 5,715 girls came out successful.

Md. Jesmul Hasan of Chittagong College stood first in Humanities Group securing 771 marks with distinctions in psychology and statistics.

Similarly, Mohammad Nazmul Ahsan of Comilla Cadet College stood first in Science and Agricultural Group securing 912 marks with distinctions in mathe-

matics, physics, chemistry and engineering drawing.

In Commerce Group, Manzurul Alam of Chittagong University College stood first securing 711 marks with distinction in statistics.

Students of Chittagong College secured 15 positions in the merit list of Humanities Group and six other positions in the merit list of Science Group. Most of the positions in Commerce Group were secured by the students of Government Commerce College, Chittagong.

Rasheda Banu of Chittagong University College secured the top position among girls in Humanities Group while Shammi Naz Amin of Comilla Victoria College and Nasrin Ahmad of Government Commerce College

secured the top positions in Science and Commerce Groups.

Of the successful candidates, 1,404 were placed in the first division, 11,104 placed in second division and the remaining 9,694 were placed in third division.

The rate of success in Science, Humanities, Commerce and Agricultural Groups were 36.95 per cent; 26.19 per cent, 31.70 per cent and 19.06 per cent, respectively.

The result shows that the percentage of success for male and female candidates are 30.45 and 29.93, respectively.

According to the Controller of Comilla Education Board, 5,386 candidates were expelled from the examination for adopting unfair means this year.

It may be mentioned that a total of 73,252 candidates appeared at the HSC examination under Comilla Board last year and 3,659 were expelled. The rate of success in 1989 was at 26.88 per cent.
