

60.97 pc pass JB SSC exams

The results of the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations held this year under Jessore Board were announced Thursday with a success rate of 60.97 per cent average in all groups.

A total of 96,685 candidates including 32,202 girls appeared at the examinations from 100 centres under Jessore Board this year. Of the total candidates 58,951 came out successful. A total of 6,955 students were placed in the First

Division and 25,162 in the Second Division.

Of the appeared candidates, 35,263 were from General Science group and 21,357 were from Social Science group. Another 61,422 appeared as private candidates in Social Science group. The rate of passing in General Science and Social science groups this year are 76.85 per cent and 51.85 per cent respectively.

Debasish Kumar Paul of Barisal Cadet College stood first

in General Science group securing 866 marks with distinction in five subjects. He was followed by Ehsanul Huq of Jhenidah Cadet College with 859 marks and distinction in six subjects. Cadets from Barisal and Jhenidah Cadet College secured first four positions.

Thirty-five students shared 20 positions in General Science group where girls failed to secure any place. Of the meritorious students, 26 were from two cadet colleges—Barisal Cadet College and Jhenidah Cadet College. The last position in the merit list was shared by six students including five from cadet colleges.

In Social Science group, Ibrahim Khalil of Khulna News Print Mills High School secured the first position in the merit list. He secured 793 marks with distinction in five subjects followed by Saidul Islam of Chowgacha Shahadat Pilot High School with 792 marks and distinction in four subjects.

Twenty-five students shared

20 positions in the merit list of Social Science group where no cadet could secure any position. Five girls secured positions in the merit list of Social Science group.

national economy is not gaining ground. He also pointed out that in many public sector offices the unnecessary spending was much and they could not play positive role in the national economy.
