

60.87 pc pass Jessore Board HSC exams

Results of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations of Jessore Board held in June-July were announced Saturday. The Pass Percentage is 60.87, reports UNB.

A total of 45,453 candidates appeared in the examinations of whom 26,615 came out successful, 3,191 securing first division, 11,496 second division and 11,928 third division.

Mohammad Mahmudur Rashid of Barisal Cadet College topped the combined merit list securing 942 marks while Mahmudul Karim of Jhenidah Cadet College stood second receiving 931 marks.

The percentage of pass in the Arts group was 60.50, in Commerce 61.66, in Agriculture Science 59.32 and in Home Economics 81.81.

The pass percentage is higher for female students in all groups except the Agriculture Science, although they could not secure any position in the combined merit list.

About 61.81 P. C. of female candidates passed the HSC examinations compared to 60.48 P. C. of male students.

The percentage of successful female examinees is higher than the male candidates by 4.01 P. C. in Science group, about 2 pc in Arts group and about 2 pc in Commerce.

In the combined merit list of women Zeenat Ferdousi of Cantonment College stood second securing 828 marks.

The highest number of 14 students of Jhenidah Cadet College secured positions in the combine merit list, followed by seven of Barisal BM College.
