The teachers congratulated Awami League chief Sheikh Hasina for suspending Bangladesh Chhatra League (A-A) on Dhaka University campus.

The teachers expressed grave concern over the acts of violence on DU campus on October 27 and July 30 and said if this type of terrorist activities continued on the campus it would ruin the future of next generation.

In a similar statement 175 teachers of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology urged the Members of the Parliament to help eliminate campus violence.

The BUET teachers said violence had become a dangerous phenomenon in our society and alleged that the government had failed to root out the vice.

The government seems reluctant to take necessary measures to eradicate campus violence, they observed.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh University Employees Federation (BUEF) at a meeting Tuesday urged all including the government, political parties the university authorities and the students community to build up a united resistance against terrorism.
