# 7-pt resolution to curb campus terrorism Major parties back govt

Major political parties Tuesday unanimously adopted a seven-point resolution to curb terrorism to establish a congenial atmosphere in educational institutions, reports BSS.

The resolution was adopted in a meeting of the political parties convened at the invitation of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia at the International Conference Centre to find out ways and means to check terrorism in every sphere of life including the campuses.

In the seven-point resolution all the political parties attending the meeting had pledged to give total support to government's any

legal step that might be taken against the illegal arms holders and terrorists.

The resolution said as the students' politics was not separate from the mainstream politics of the country, the section of students creating anarchy and terrorism had been urged by the main parties to refrain from politics of hatred.

The political parties called for resisting all future acts of terrorism with all strength and sincerity. The meeting expressed determination to extend its total support in the efforts of government administration and law enforcing agencies to contain terrorism.

The resolution said that no political party would assist any criminal if legal actions were taken and arms holders if they were given punishment.

The parties had agreed to resist the non-students to stay in the residential halls of the universities.

The resolution said that no political party or student organisation will provide shelter to the arms holders in the campuses. All parties will discard the terrorists politically as soon as his identity is revealed.

In the resolution, the political parties have called upon the teachers and authorities of the universi-

ties to assist the efforts to free the campus from arms.
