

Vandalism of SSC students

SIRAJGANJ, Nov 5: Students of a school Tuesday attacked a train and a railway ferry at Jagannathganjghat even after government announcement retaining the bank of objective questions in the next SSC examination, reports UNB.

Station sources said over 200 students of Tigna High School attacked Padma Express and MV Suhrawardy and assaulted 20 people at about 2 pm.

The Sareng and the master of the ferry were among the injured who were given first aid.

The school boys badly damaged several doors and windows of the train and station master's room at the station.

Ferry and train services were disrupted for about three hours following the attack.

The government, in the wake of student agitation, has decided to retain the bank of 500 objective-type questions in the SSC examination 1992.
