

1833 more HSC examinees expelled

A total of 1833 HSC examinees was expelled all over the country on Thursday, third day of the ongoing HSC examinations under four educational boards, for adopting unfair means in the examination of English first paper.

The highest number of expulsion was made in the Rajshahi Board. A total of 890 examinees were expelled.

A total of 466 students were expelled in Dhaka Board, according to the Controller of Examination of the board. While in Jessore Board, the figure of expulsion was at 138 from 45 centres out of 158. Examination in all centres under this board held peacefully, a official of the Jessore Board informed.

Controller of Examinations of Comilla Board told Bangladesh Times that a total of 339 examinees were expelled yesterday (Thursday). Of them 100 students were expelled from 22 centres of the Chittagong District. 265 students were also absent from the examination in the district yesterday, district control room said.

Meanwhile, several unruly
