## Students, teachers urged to help create a terrorism free campus

GOPALGANJ, Aug 18: Education, Primary and Mass Education and Science and Technology Minister ASHK Sadeque called upon the students, teachers and guardians to help create terrorism free campus for ensuring academic atmosphere in the educational arena, reports UNB.

He was speaking as chief guest at the installation ceremony of the students union of Sheikh Lutfar Rahman Adarsha Government College at Kotalipara on Saturday, said an official handout.

Presided over by acting Principal of the college Ziaul Hasan, the function was addressed by State Minister for Disaster Management and Relief Talukder Abdul Khaleque and General Secretary of

Gopalganj district Awami League Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah as special guests.

The function was also addressed, by President, Bangladesh Chhatra League (S-P) Enamul Haque Shamim, newly elected Vice-President of the college student union Kamrul Islam Shah and a number of district and thana level Awami League and its front organisational leaders.
