



Highest priority to education given : Biswas

President Abdur Rahman Biswas stressed the need for qualitative improvement of education to enable students to succeed in the highly competitive world, reports UNB.

"Raising the standard of education, entirely dependents upon the sincere and devoted endeavour of teacher and educationists, he observed.

President Biswas was talking to a 17-members of delegation of the Barisal unit of Bangladesh Teachers' Association when they called on him at Bangabhaban Wednesday.
