

Violence free campus urged, 11 buses given to edn institutions

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia on Wednesday called upon the people belonging to all strata of life to cooperate with the present government in implementing various development oriented programmes aimed at achieving national progress and prosperity, reports BSS.

"We have to be united for the sake of the country's interest," Begum Zia said while handing over keys and documents of transports to different educational institutions at a simple function at the International Conference Centre (ICC) in Dhaka.

Jamiruddin Sircar, DUCSU Vice President Amanullah Aman MP, CUCSU Vice President Nazimuddin and Vice President of Eden Girls College Central Students Union Helen Zerin Khan.

She said violence and indiscipline could never lead a country, besieged with many problems, to progress and prosperity. She said that the autocratic regime had left behind a trail of devastation in all the sectors which she said could not be solved just in one year.

1,400 TEACHERS PROMOTED

The Prime Minister referred to various steps taken by her government for the welfare of the teachers and said 1,400 teachers were promoted by this government and more teachers would be appointed.

On primary education, Begum Zia said, we want to educate our children properly and added that "the base should be solid".

Ministers, members of parliament, Vice Chancellors, Principals and student leaders of the respective institutions were present.

The Prime Minister later went to see the buses, kept in front of her office.
