## Sircar thanks teachers SSC exams go on peacefully

The SSC examination of the year 1994 under four education boards of the country is being held throughout the country peacefully, reports BSS.

On the second day on Tuesday of the examination, an official handout said, Education Minister Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar visited SSC examination centres at Moghbazar Girls High School, Motijheel Model School, Agrani Girls School and Dhanmondi Government Boys High School in the capital.

The Minister found that the teachers were conducting the examination in all of these centres and the examinees had filled up computer forms correctly. He expressed satisfaction over the peaceful atmosphere in and around the examination centres.

Education Secretary Irshadul Haq, D G of Secondary and Higher Education Prof. Eunus Mia and Chairman of Dhaka Board Prof. Latisur-Rahman accompanied the Minister during the visit.

A total of 28 examinees were expelled from the examinations throughout the district for adopting unfair means.

The expulsion break-up is: Manikganj Sadar -4, Ghor-4, Daulatpur -18 and Harirampur Jhitka centre -2.

Our Rajshahi Correspondent adds: A total of 149 examinees were expelled from the SSC examinations on the second day today throughout the Rajshahi education board comprising 16 districts.

The districtwise break up of expulsion is: Rajshahi-3, Nawabganj-2, Natore-2, Naogaon-2, Pabna-1, Sirajganj-2, Bogra-14, Jaipurhat-2, Rangpur-13, Gaibandha-5, Niphamari-7, Kurigram-9, Dinajpur-68, Thakurgaon-16 and Panchagar-3.

Meanwhile 227 examinees were expelled from SSC examinations on Monday for adopting unfair means in the examinations.

#### KUSHTIA

Report from Kushtia adds: At least six examinees were expelled on the first day of SSC examination in the district yesterday.

Out of 13283 candidates 13126 appeared in the examination from twenty seven centres of Kushtia district. It is reported that the SSC examination in all centres was held peacefully. The district administration took all steps to maintain peaceful condition in the examination centres.
