Int'l Literacy Day today Call to help wipe out illiteracy

Our Staff Reporter adds: The International literacy Day will be observed in Bangladesh today (Thursday) in a befitting manner as elsewhere in the world. Ministry of Education and its different wings and various organisations have chalked out elaborate programmes to mark the day.

On the eve of the day, President Abdur Rahman Biswas in a message called upon the people to take a fresh vow to uproot the curse of illiteracy from the country and build up a happy and prosperous nation. He said illiterate people are main obstacle to development and only education can turn the population into productive human resources.

KHALEDA

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia in a message sought co-operation of conscious section of the society to make the government efforts a success in eradicating illiteracy. She said right to education

UNB report says: Awami League President and Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Sheikh Hasina has called for combatting the curse of illiteracy to establish a poverty-free Bangladesh.

In a message on Wednesday on the eve of International Literacy Day, she expressed concern at the downward trend of literacy in the country and said it had taken "an alarming shape because of the government's indifference to the problem."

Hasina mentioned that Awami League, in its manifesto, incorporated a literacy programme and compulsory free primary education with due priority. "We want to remove illiteracy in next 10 years under specific programmes ensuring education for the Poor."

On the occasion, Primary and mass education department will hold a discussion meeting at the Osmani Memorial Auditorium.
