



24 pc educational wastage at primary level

The rate of educational wastage at the primary level is 24 per cent. Of this 15 per cent is caused by detention of students at different classes, and nine per cent due to drop-out.

According to the preliminary report of a survey, boys have four per cent higher wastage rate than girls. The wastage rate is 30 per cent higher in case of urban areas compared to rural areas.

The findings were presented at the seminar on "school wastage and strategies to reduce drop-out and repetition" on Sunday by Mr. Mahmood Aminul Islam, former Additional Secretary of the Ministry of Education. The seminar is being organised jointly by UNESCO and the Government of Bangladesh.

Under the survey data for 5615 students from 67 schools (59 rural and 8 urban) in

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discipline and congenial academic atmosphere.
