Pry schools in Jessore beset with problems

JESSORE, Dec. 5: Hundreds of primary schools in Jessore district are beset with manifold problems. The major problems are shortage of requisite numbers of teachers, shortage of text books, poor condition of the school buildings, lack of accommodation, absence of educational amenities and above all internal conflict and high irregularities among teachers and management, it is reported.

According to a report from Abhaynagar police station, a number of primary schools are facing serious crisis due to absence of Government grants and incentives to the teachers. On the other hand absence of requisite number of chairs, tables and benches posed serious threat to academic environment of the school. The students have to procure their own sitting arrangement. Even hessian sacks

and mats were seen in these schools.

LACK OF FUND

The Jhenidah reports says that a good number of primary teachers are facing acute financial crisis and passing through uncertainty as sixteen primary schools in six police stations of Jhenidah subdivision have not yet been taken up by the Government. The local people contributed to construct school houses and purchase furnitures but the prevailing economic condition of these schools further deteriorated.

The primary school building of Jokarchar village under Kalia police station which was blown away two years ago due to storm is yet to be repaired. Besides, reports of such deteriorating condition of most of the primary schools in the district are pouring in every day.
