

DUTA calls off strike, DU classes resume

Classes of Dhaka University resumed Saturday following 40-day closure as the Dhaka University Teachers Association (DUTA) called off their strike scheduled.

Most of the classes were held in a peaceful atmosphere, class attendance was, however, thin on the day.

The DUTA went on work ab-

stention for an indefinite period since November 2 protesting government failure to take effective measure for eradication of campus violence.

The DUTA began its abstention programme following a bloody gunbattle between the activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (A-A) student front of Awami League and Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) student wing of BNP on October 27 which caused death to four persons including two student of the university.

Meanwhile, Dhaka University Provost Committee ((DUPC) at a meeting Thursday adopted a resolution reiterating its decision that no prior permission would not needed for the law enforcing personnel to enter into the campus to push out violence.
