# Date of exams in medical colleges won't be deferred

MYMENSINGH, June 19 (BSS): The Deputy Prime Minister in charge of the Ministry of Health and Family Planning Prof. M. A. Matin said the government had undertaken a good number of administrative steps to bring about positive changes in medical education and hospital management.

He was addressing the internee doctors and members of the teaching staff of Mymensingh Medical College Hospital Friday night. The administrative steps are completion of the syllabus and holding examinations in time, completion of examination in one month and bringing out the results within a fortnight.

He said financial and administrative powers of the Principals and training facilities for the teachers would be increased besides increasing the teacher-student and student ratio, he added.

The DPM said, government was committed to eliminate Malpractices in the examinations once for all. He said, government would do everyth-

ing possible to ensure peace and tranquility in the academic arena with the sincere cooperation of the teachers and students.

Henceforth, the date of examinations in the Medical Colleges would not be deferred in any case neither the quality of the examination, be compromised with. the DPM emphatically said adding 'we should not put the future of our posterity on jeopardy. Prof. Matin said, all concerned quarters had to endeavour hard in a cohesive and concerted manner to help develop the overall health care services in the country.

Earlier, he went round different wards and units of the hospital including the eye-bank unit run by the Sandhani, Coronary Care unit, emergency and casualty block and labour ward. He asked the authority to maintain utmost cleanliness in and around hospital campus

On way to Mymensingh, Prof. Matin addressed a spontaneous gathering at Mashkanda where he said, President Ershad did everything for the wellbeing of the commonman.
