DU examinees go on rampage

A group of master degree (preliminary) examinees of Dhaka University ransacked several rooms of the university administrative building and arts faculty building and caused damage to three motor vehicles Wednesday afternoon in support of their demand for shifting their examination dates.

The 'master' degree (preliminary) examination is schedule to begin on May 8 next.

Examinees became violent when university authorities said they were firm to hold the examination on schedule.

The students gathered in front of the DU Vice-Chancellor's office and demanded rescheduling of the examinations. When the Vice-Chancellor informed that under no cir-

cumstances, the examination schedule would be changed, the students became agitated and started pelting stones at the window panes of the administrative building. They also damaged three motor vehicles parked near the building.

The students then went to the Arts Faculty building and damaged properties belonging to various departments.

Meanwhile, deans and chairmen of different departments in a meeting with Vice-Chancellor Prof. Emazuddin Ahmed in the chair strongly condemned the incident.

The meeting reviewed the prevailing situation on the campus and advised the students to refrain from doing any kinds of anti-disciplinary activities.

The meeting in another resolution called upon the students to maintain peace and congenial atmosphere on the campus.

A probe committee has been formed to find out students responsible for anti-disciplinary activities on Wednesday. The meeting also suggested stern action against the students involved in the incident.
