



Body to probe killing of expelled DU student

The Dhaka University authorities on Monday constituted an inquiry committee to investigate the killing of an expelled student inside Mohsin Hall.

on Sunday evening.
The four-member inquiry committee headed by the Law Faculty Dean Prof K A A Kamruddin, will submit its report by December 25.

The authorities also postponed all examinations scheduled to be held from today (Tuesday) up to December 15 at the DU centre and U. Laboratory School due to unavoidable circumstances. Examinations at all other centres under Dhaka University will, however, be held as per schedule they said.

The decision was taken in a meeting at the Vice-Chancellor's residence with the Vice-Chancellor Prof Abdul Mannan in the chair.

Terming the expelled students as 'unwanted in the university campus' the meeting in a resolution called upon all the sections to cooperate with the authorities to keep the campus free from arms and terror and help maintain congenial academic atmosphere.

A statement issued by the Registrar pointed out that the authorities were 'shocked and surprised' at the assassination of the expelled student Bazlur Rahman Khan Shaheed at Mohsin Hall on Sunday night.

The Registrar also said that if any outsider or non-student was found residing in any of the student dormitory, firm steps would be taken against them.

Meanwhile, the body of Bazlur Rahman Shaheed was handed over to his relatives after postmortem at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) around 12 noon on Monday. The body was taken to his village home at Mirzaganj of Patuakhali for burial.

The Chhatra Dal held a 'Gayebana Janaja' of Shaheed at the Arts Faculty building of Dhaka University Monday noon.

An agitated section of students brought out a few processions on Dhaka University campus from Monday evening and ransacked some window panes and notice boards at the Arts Faculty building.

They also prevented the students from attending their classes which were cut short. The percentage of class atten-

dance was also thin on the day. The processions also ransacked the D U snacks shop which belonged to the expelled JCD leader Takdeer Hossain Jashim.

Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) called for observing strike in Dhaka University today (Tuesday) and in all educational institution of the country on Thursday.

The JCD President Asaduzzaman Ripan made the call for strike from a rally held at Dhaka University on Monday protesting the killing of the JCD leader Bazlur Rahman Shaheed.

The JCD at an emergency meeting on Monday noon expelled three of its central leaders for their involvement with anti-organisational activities. The expelled leaders were Cultural Secretary Takdeer Hossain, Mohammad Jashim, member Shahidul Islam and worker Kamruzzaman Babu.

The JCD at a statement termed the killing as a cold blooded and pre-planned assassination by a vested quarter. 'The JCD demanded a fair inquiry into the incident and exemplary punishment of the killers.

BNP Secretary General Barisur Abdus Salam Talukder Monday condemned the killing of Bazlur Rahman Shaheed, a Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal leader at Mohsin Hall of Dhaka University on Sunday.

In a Press statement the BNP leader said to foil the on-going movement the Government had resorted to such acts in the educational institutions. He demanded punishment to the persons responsible for the killing.

The Central Students Action Council (CSAC), Bangladesh Islami Chhatra Shibir, Chhatra Dal (JCD, Kamaluddin) and Jatiya Janata Party at separate statements expressed concern at the killing Shaheed inside Mohsin Hall and demanded an inquiry into the incident.
