



DU administration failed to maintain peace on campus

Dhaka University Teachers Association (DUTA) on Tuesday asserted that the University administration had failed to maintain peace on the campus and ensure security for the teachers and the students following the DUCSU election.

Addressing a press conference at the University Press Club Pfor Mashiuzzaman, President of the Association said: We did not consider it condemnable.

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and House Tuors of Haji Muhammad Mohsin Hall stated that the Vice-Chancellor did not respond to their appeal for help when the armed people attacked them and the resident students of the hall, exploded bombs, opened gun shots and set the rooms of the hall on fire on Wednesday last.

Replying to a question, Prof. Mashiuzzaman said: we could not identify the persons who attacked the female students and the Mohsin Hall. DUTA demanded stern action against the responsible persons.

In a written statement, Dr. Zaman refuted the allegations of Chhatra Dal and BNP leaders in connection with the procedures of DUCSU polls as baseless and imaginary.

Dr. Zaman demanded withdrawal of the statement made by BNP leader Khaleda Zia and asked her to apologise publicly.

Earlier in the morning, DU teachers brought out a silent procession on the campus to protest post-election violence.

The procession ended in a brief rally at Central Shaheed Minar.

Meanwhile, Dhaka University Officers Association in a statement on Tuesday condemned post-poll violence and sought cooperation from all concerns to keep the campus congenial for academic activities.
