Exam scandal: CU dismisses 2 top officials

CHITTAGONG, July 7 : Two top officials of the Chittagong University, including the Controller of Examinations, were Thursday dismissed for their involvement in an examination scandal, reports UNB.

Campus sources said the University authorities also took punitive action against four teachers of the Philosophy Department for the same allegation.

The University Syndicate took the action against the accused at a meeting with Vice-Chancellor Rafiqul Islam Chowdhury in the chair today.

The Syndicate dismissed the Controller of Examinations GM Latif Khan and senior examination official Abdus Sattar after the allegation of tampering the results of honours final year examinations of Philosophy Department has been proved.

Punitive actions against the four teachers—Abdul Khaleq, Afsar Ali, Muzaffar Ahmed and Mozammel Hossain—were taken for their involvement in the scandal.

Abdul Khaleq and Afsar Ali have been suspended from taking part in the examination activities of the university for the next one year while Muzaffar Ahmed and Mozammel Hossain will not get annual increment for a year.
